ACTS 2

- 1. What did all the believers do after Jesus returned to heaven?
- -The believers returned to Jerusalem and waited for Jesus to baptize them with the Holy Spirit.
- 2. How were the believers baptized with the Holy Spirit?
- -Jesus sent the Holy Spirit down from heaven to come into the hearts and lives of the believers.
- 3. Where does the Holy Spirit live today?
- -He lives in everyone who believes in Christ.
- 4. Do Christians today need to wait to be baptized with the Holy Spirit?
- -No.
- -If you believe that Jesus has saved you from your sin, then the Holy Spirit has already come to live in you.
- 5. What does it mean to be filled with the Holy Spirit? -It means to be controlled by the Holy Spirit.
- 6. If we allow the Holy Spirit to control us, how will this help us?
- -The Holy Spirit will help us to obey God.
- -The Holy Spirit will help us to understand God and His Word.
- -The Holy Spirit will help us to live and witness for

Jesus.

- 7. What did Peter say was the evidence that Jesus was now sitting at the Father's right hand as Lord of heaven and earth?
- -That the Holy Spirit had come to live in the lives of those who believe in Christ.
- 8. Why did Peter say that Jesus is the Christ?
- -Because Jesus is the greatest Prophet of God.
- -Because Jesus is the greatest High Priest.
- -Because Jesus is the greatest King.
- 9. What did many Jews do when they understood that they were sinners and believed in Jesus as their Savior? -They were baptized.
- -In the Bible, the first baptisms were by John the Baptist.

Let's read Matthew 3:1-2 & 5-6

- 1-In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the Desert of Judea.
- 2-and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near."
- 5-People went out to him from Jerusalem and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan.
- 6-Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

- -John the Baptist taught the people that they should repent of their sins for the Savior was coming soon.
- -Those who agreed with God's message that John taught were baptized.
- -In the Bible, this baptism is known as John's baptism.
- -Those who were baptized by John believed that they had sinned against God.
- -Those who were baptized by John believed that God would send the Savior to save them from their sins.
- -Before Jesus began His ministry on earth, He was baptized by John:

Let's read Luke 3:21-22

- 21-When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened
- 22-and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."
- -After John baptized Jesus with water, God the Holy Spirit descended from heaven onto Jesus.
- -During all of Jesus' years on earth, He allowed God the

Holy Spirit to control Him, and to speak through Him.

-Before Jesus returned to heaven, He told His disciples what they must do.

Let's read Matthew 28:18-20

18-Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

19-Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

20-and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

- -Jesus told His disciples to baptize all who believed in Christ as their Savior.
- -Is there a difference between John's baptism and the baptism that Jesus commanded His disciples?
- -Here is what John the Baptist said:

Let's read Mark 1:8

8-[John said] "I baptize you with water, but [Christ] will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

-What is necessary for baptism?

- -For baptism, two steps are necessary. What are these two steps?
- -The first step of baptism is repentance.
- -John's baptism was a baptism of repentance.
- -John called on the people to repent of their sins, and be baptized.
- -The second step of baptism is receiving God into your life.
- -One may also look at baptism as follows:
- -The first step is asking God to take away the bad.
- -The second step is asking God to fill you with the good.
- -The first step is asking God to take away your sin.
- -The second step is asking God to come into your life.
- -Because God is holy and cannot live with sin, the step of repentance must come first, asking God to take sin away.
- -Then, and only then, can God the Holy Spirit fill your life.
- -John's baptism of repentance was the first step,

- -Yet the second step of receiving the Holy Spirit needed to wait until Jesus returned to heaven to send the Holy Spirit.
- -What does the baptism of John teach?
- -That people had repented and were waiting for the Savior to come.
- -What does the baptism that Jesus gave to His disciples teach?
- -That people have repented, and have believed in Jesus as their Savior.
- -In whose name did Jesus tell the disciples to baptize believers?
- -In the name of God the Father, God the Savior, and God the Holy Spirit.
- -If we believe in Christ, God is now our Father, Jesus is now our Savior, and the Holy Spirit now lives in us.
- -How did John the Baptist baptize those who repented?
- -He lowered them under the water, and raised them up again.
- -How did Jesus tell His disciples to baptize those who

believed in Christ?

- -To lower them under the water, and raise them up again.
- -In baptism, how is being lowered below the water a picture of death?
- -It is a picture of Jesus dying for our sins.
- -It is also a picture of Christians dying to sin.
- -For the Christian, Jesus' death is our death.
- -God says that the sinful part of all who believe in Christ died when Jesus died.
- -In baptism, how is being raised back up above the water a picture of new life?
- -It is a picture of Jesus rising from the dead.
- -It is also a picture of Christians rising to a new life.
- -For the Christian, Jesus' resurrection is our resurrection.
- -God says that all who believe in Christ were raised to a new life when Jesus rose from death to life.
- -Can baptism wash away a person's sins?
- -No.
- -Can baptism pay for our sins?
- -No.

- -Must a person be baptized to be saved?
- -No.
- -Why cannot baptism save us?
- -Because baptism is that which people do, and there is nothing that people can do to save themselves.
- -Because the death of Christ on the cross alone is all that can save us from sin, death, and Satan.
- -We became children of God immediately when we believe in Jesus as our Savior.
- -If we believe in Christ, we can go to heaven even if we are never baptized.
- -Why should believers be baptized?
- -Because Jesus commanded believers to do so.
- -Why did Jesus command believers to be baptized?
- -To teach us and to teach others.
- -When we are baptized, what are we teaching ourselves and others?
- -That the death of Christ is our death.
- -That the resurrection of Christ is our resurrection.
