2 Timothy 2

- 1. What is better for us—the will of God or our own will? -The will of God.
- 2. If we believe in Christ, will we die?
- -No.
- -Even though our bodies will one day be buried in the ground, the soul of every Christian will never die.
- 3. Is it possible to constantly pray?
- -Yes.
- 4. How is it possible to constantly pray?
- -We must simply always be talking to God in our spirit about everything that is in our lives.
- 5. Do we always need to use our voice when we talk to God?
- -No.
- -We can talk to God in our mind and in our heart without having to use our voice.
- 6. After Christ, what should be our greatest joy?Our family in Christ.
- 7. What does it mean to "fan into flame the gift of God"?
 -It means to use all that God has given us to reach out to the lost as well as to encourage other Christians.
- 8. Does "fan into flame" mean that the fire of our

salvation can die?

- -No.
- -The salvation of Christ in our lives can never die.
- 9. Are we able to lay our hands on others to cause them to believe in Christ?
- -No.
- -Belief cannot come from the outside.
- -Belief must come from the inside.
- -Belief must come from the heart.
- 10. If you are a Christian, have you been given the Holy Spirit?
- -Yes.
- 11. What has the Lord Jesus done for all Christians?
- -Destroyed death and given us immortality.
- 12. Why do Christians suffer when they teach the Word of God?
- -Because Satan and his demons do not want people to know the truth.
- -Because Satan and his demons do not want people to ask God to save them.
- 13. Does going to church cause you to be a Christian? -No.
- 14. Does becoming a leader in the church cause you to be a Christian?
- -No.

- 1-You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus.
- -With this verse, Paul is once again calling Timothy his spiritual son in Christ.
- -As Christians, we should look after one another.
- -For those older than us, we should see them as our older brothers and sisters in Christ.
- -For those younger than us, we should see them as our younger brothers and sisters in Christ.
- -This is also why the Lord Jesus sent out His disciples two by two because we need one another.
- -How can we be strong in the grace of Christ Jesus?
- -Christ has given His grace to all Christians.
- -It is simply a matter of allowing the grace of Christ to control our lives.
- -How do we allow the grace of Christ to control our lives?
- -We must simply ask God.

-This is probably the most difficult work we will ever have.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:2

- 2-And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.
- -In the past, when Paul taught the Word of God, Paul also taught Timothy who was with him.
- -Whenever we teach the Word of God, we should teach so that those whom we teach can also teach others.
- -Jesus taught His disciples so that they could also teach others.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:3-4

- 3-Join with me in suffering, like a good soldier of Christ Jesus.
- 4-No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in civilian affairs, but rather tries to please his commanding officer.
- -How is a Christian like a soldier?
- -Just as a soldier must obey his commanding officer to win the war, we must also obey Christ to win the war against the world, the flesh, and Satan.

-If we allow Christ to be the commanding officer, we can rest in knowing that Christ will lead us to win.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:5

- 5-Similarly, anyone who competes as an athlete does not receive the victor's crown except by competing according to the rules.
- -How is a Christian like an athlete?
- -Just as an athlete follows the rules to win the race, we must also follow the rules of Christ to win the race against the world, the flesh, and Satan.
- -What are the rules of Christ?
- -Allowing the Lord Jesus to be our coach who will train us.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:6

- 6-The hardworking farmer should be the first to receive a share of the crops.
- -How is a Christian like a hardworking farmer?
- -Just like the hardworking farmer is the first to receive a share of his crops, if we work hard alongside of the Lord Jesus, we will also receive the fruit of our work.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:7

- 7-Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you insight into all this.
- -Can we learn by simply listening to the truths of God? -No.
- -We must not only listen to the truths of God, but also think about them so that we can use them in our lives.
- -Only after listening and thinking about God's truths are we able to use them to change our lives.
- -Here is an illustration:
- -A man goes to the doctor, and the doctor tells him that he is sick, and then gives him medicine.
- -But the man puts the medicine in his pocket, and does not swallow the medicine.
- -Will the man be healed?
- -No.
- -Why not?
- -Even though the man listened to the doctor, he did not think that he needed to swallow the medicine.
- -To listen to the truths of God is not enough.

- -Those who are not Christians can listen to the truths of God, but if they do not believe, they will not be saved.
- -There are also Christians who listen to the truths of God, but do not think how these truths can help us.
- -Even Satan listens to the truths of God.
- -We must not only listen to the truths of God, but also think about them so that we can use them in our lives.
- -It is our God, however, who helps us to understand His truths so that we can use them to change our lives.

8-Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my gospel.

- -Why does this verse tell us to remember Jesus Christ?
- -Because we all need to be reminded of the foundation of our faith.
- -Who is the foundation of our faith?
- -The Lord Jesus Christ.
- -Without the death and resurrection of Christ, no one can be saved.
- -With the death and resurrection of Christ, we Christians

have died to sin and been resurrected with Christ.

- -Is this gospel only the gospel of Paul?
- -No.
- -Why did Paul say that this is "my gospel"?
- -Because Paul not only heard and thought of the truths of God, but made them his own.
- -Just as a sheep herder owns his sheep because they belong to him, a Christian should own God because we belong to God and not Satan.
- -All Christians should own our God of the Bible.
- -By saving us, God has made us His own, and we should make God our own.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:9-10

9-for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's word is not chained.

- 10-Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.
- -Even though Paul was chained when he wrote this letter, he knew that no one can chain the Word of God.

- -People can say that the Bible is not true, but no one has ever found a lie in the Bible because it has only the truths of God.
- -People can burn the Bible, but the truths of God can never be burned.
- -People can put Christians in prison, but our hearts can never be imprisoned.
- -In John 8:32, the Lord Jesus said this:
- -"You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

- 11-Here is a trustworthy saying: If we died with him, we will also live with him;
- -When did Christians die with Christ?
- -When we believed that the death of Christ alone can pay the punishment for our sins, then the death of Christ becomes our death, and we die with Christ.
- -What do Christians die to?
- -We die to sin which means that sin no longer has any control over us.

- -Sin is no longer our master nor can sin kill us.
- -How do we live with Christ?
- -The resurrection of Christ from the dead becomes our resurrection from the dead, and our lives become one with Christ.
- -As Christians, we look too much at our physical bodies, and we forget that our new heart in Christ will never die.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:12

12-If we endure, we will also reign with him. If we disown him, he will also disown us;

- -What is it that we must endure?
- -We must endure the world of sin, Satan, and our old ways before we were saved which is called our flesh.
- -Are Christians more powerful than sin, Satan, and the flesh?
- -No.
- -Only Christ is more powerful than sin, Satan, and the flesh.
- -This means that we can only endure with Christ's help.

- -If we endure with Christ's help, then we will also reign with Christ one day in the new heaven and on the new earth.
- -Can Christ disown us?
- -No.
- -If we believe in the Lord Jesus, no one can steal us away from Him (John 6:37; John 10:29).
- -What does the teaching 2 Timothy 2:12 mean?
- -God through Paul is reminding us of what the Lord Jesus said in Matthew 10:33:
- -"But whoever denies Me before men, him I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven."
- -The Lord Jesus will only disown and deny those who disown and deny Him.
- -All Christians, of course, do not deny nor disown Christ, for we know that Christ is our very salvation from death.

13-If we are faithless, he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself.

- -Sometimes, Christians think that their lack of faith in God will somehow cause God to reject them.
- -This is not true.

- -Even if our faith is not perfect, God remains faithful to those whom He has saved.
- -Because God is perfect, His work to save us is also perfect.
- -Because God is perfect, He cannot disown Himself nor His perfect work in our lives.

Let's read 2 Timothy 2:14

14-Keep reminding God's people of these things. Warn them before God against quarreling about words; it is of no value, and only ruins those who listen.

- -Why do we need to remind one another of the truths of our God?
- -Because the world wants us to become like them.
- -Because our flesh or our old ways want us to be selfish and think only of ourselves.
- -Because Satan wants our lives to be of no use in this world.
- -We should also not argue about that which is not important.
- -Many churches have been broken by people arguing about that which is not important.
